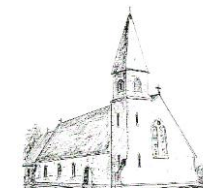

Pentecost

“Were not our hearts burning within us as he talked to us on the road and opened the scriptures to us?” Christ after his Resurrection opened the hearts of his disciples on the road to Emmaus and lit within them a fire of devotion to the truth of his Mission, his Life, Death and Resurrection.
