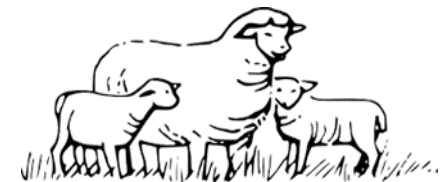
## *Feed My Lambs, Feed My Sheep*

In every sense of the word there is a very pastoral feeling to this week's Gospel. There is the sense of providing for the flock as a shepherd would do. Then there is the sense of the mission that Christ entrusted to Peter and the apostles. "Feed my lambs, feed my sheep".

Just as the story of Thomas last week in doubting the Resurrection of Christ represents all of us and all of our doubts in hard times, then so also does Peter represent us here in the mission of Christ. In our own way each of us has a mission, we have a flock to tend, even if that flock may at times consist only of one, ourselves. We have to feed that spirit, which is helped greatly by our weekly visit to Mass and the Sacraments and listening to the Word.

Catching fish and providing food for multitudes seems to come easy to Christ; we have seen a number of occasions in his story where he provides for the needy. This is to show us that his love and his care for us is boundless. It was less easy for the Apostles as we can see from the Acts of the Apostles, and we can be sure it will not always be easy for us.

It's not about easy though, it's about faith, and we should remember to feed it.



## Parish Finance Annual Report

This weekend the Parish Finance Committee presents the Parish Finance Annual Report for the year ended 31st December 2018. Copies will be distributed after all Masses.

The Parish Finance Committee wishes to thank parishioners for their continuing generosity.

2018 was a landmark year for the Parish as we opened our Pastoral Centre. We look forward to the Pastoral Centre contributing significantly to the pastoral activities of the parish in the years ahead.

In terms of the day-to-day running of the parish, our main source of income (i.e. standing orders and family envelopes) was down 1% on the previous year but was boosted by a small number of very generous once off donations and also two years of tax refunds which we claimed in 2018. It is important to point out that monies collected at Masses or via Dues are remitted directly to the Diocese, and do not go towards the cost of running our local parish.

2011 was the last time we ran a campaign to increase our standing orders and family envelopes. With so many new parishioners since then, we feel that now is an opportune time to ask new and existing parishioners to review their financial support for the pastoral services provided

### What is the hands for life programme

The Irish Heart Foundation is on a mission to save lives. Hands for Life: Community CPR Training is an Irish Heart Foundation programme, supported by Abbott and ESB Networks, which will see free CPR training offered in communities across Ireland.

Everyday in Ireland 13 people die from a cardiac arrest and around 70% of these happen at home. Unfortunately, just 6.5% of people in Ireland who have a cardiac arrest in a non-hospital setting survive. With Hands for Life, the Irish Heart Foundation is offering an exciting, free community CPR training programme in communities with the support of Abbott and ESB Networks. Through this programme, we aim to train 100,000 people in the life-saving skill of CPR.

It is an hour long course including a practical element of performing CPR on a manikin. The course will be delivered by an experienced Irish Heart Foundation instructor. For more information on the course visit the Irish Heart Foundation website.
