### ***Sunday of the Word of God, as designated by Pope Francis.***

There is an immediacy in all of the readings today that highlights the urgency with which Christ called his disciples, and through them called to us. When Jonah was called by God he did not want to travel to a pagan city to proclaim repentance, but God persisted, Jonah goes with the message he has been given, and it proves to be Good News, the Ninevites repented and so God relented and spared them.

Saint Paul proposes a level of detachment from the world as he says the form of this world is passing away. This means we need first to have our eye on the Word rather than the world, so that we are able to "repent, and believe in the good news".

We are in awe that the disciples drop everything when Jesus asks them to follow him. Would we be as quick to leave everything behind? However, and luckily, we are not required to leave behind the people and the things we love. Instead our call is to follow Jesus *in* our lives, to embrace the Word. We can do this by attending to the Good News of Jesus as we live our lives in Christ and answer our vocation with integrity.
