## **Apocalypse Now**

This week in the Sunday Gospel the words of Jesus describe the End of the World. Scary language. Our Church is reminding us towards the end of the liturgical year that there will be an end to everything, something which we forget at times but as mortal humans something that we know in our hearts.

But Gospel means "good news" and so there is a paradox between this apocalyptic language and Christ's promise of eternal life for "those whose names are written in the Book" as promised by Daniel in the Old Testament.

We are being asked here to behave as Christ's chosen and as if every day would be our last day on Earth. Because we do not know the day nor the hour. A simple message in scary language, we as Christians know Christ's promise, so we need to stay awake and stand ready.
